CONTEXT: 1st John was written so that we can know that our faith is true saving faith (1 John 5:13). The Bible emphasizes and warns that there are many people professing to be Christians, thinking they are saved but are not. It is a most important and necessary writing for all persons to know by biblical assurance the reality of their salvation. All people who are justified by faith will also be in the process of being sanctified in their life. 1st John is about the marks of sanctification (the work of God in saved lives), or reality of being in God's defined sanctification process. The epistle provides contrasts with the attitudes and actions of the saved, as compared with the unsaved. John will make this contrast evident throughout this important epistle. The epistle begins with the reality of the Person of Christ. The fact of Christ as God and the reality of His glorious coming to die, save, and transform sinners is the foundation for all salvation.
