CONTEXT: John writes a self-test to understand who is born of God, saved, and who is not. He continues to move through a section of holy Scripture dealing with Christians and their restored fellowship with God through Jesus Christ. We have seen that fellowship cannot exist if a person walks in darkness, meaning leading a double life practicing sin. We have also seen that Christians, although not slaves to sin, do sin and God has provided an advocate for restoration, our Lord Jesus. Now John moves discussing our obedience that is also required for fellowship with God. Those who love Christ and have been touched by His transforming grace will seek in every

way to please Him in their life. The life of a Christian is a changed life.
