II.	<u>His Presence in Flesh</u> – Jesus took on true humanity through the virgin birth, without ceasing to be God, in order to live among us, suffer for us, and represent us – (Jn 1:14; Isa 7:14; Heb 2:14–17; Phil 2:5–8; Heb

III.	His Passion and Power Over Death – Jesus died in our place, bearing God's wrath for our sin, and rose
	bodily from the grave to secure our justification and eternal life – (5:6–8; Isa 53:4–6; 2 Cor 5:21; 1 Cor
	15:3–4; Rom 4:25):

IV. <u>His Promised Return</u> – Jesus is exalted at the Father's right hand and will soon return – first for His Church, then to reign on the earth as King – (Acts 1:11; John 14:3; Titus 2:13; 1 Thes 4:16–17; Rev 1:7; Zech 14:4–5; Rev 19:11–16; Ps 2:6–9; Rev 20:4): ______
